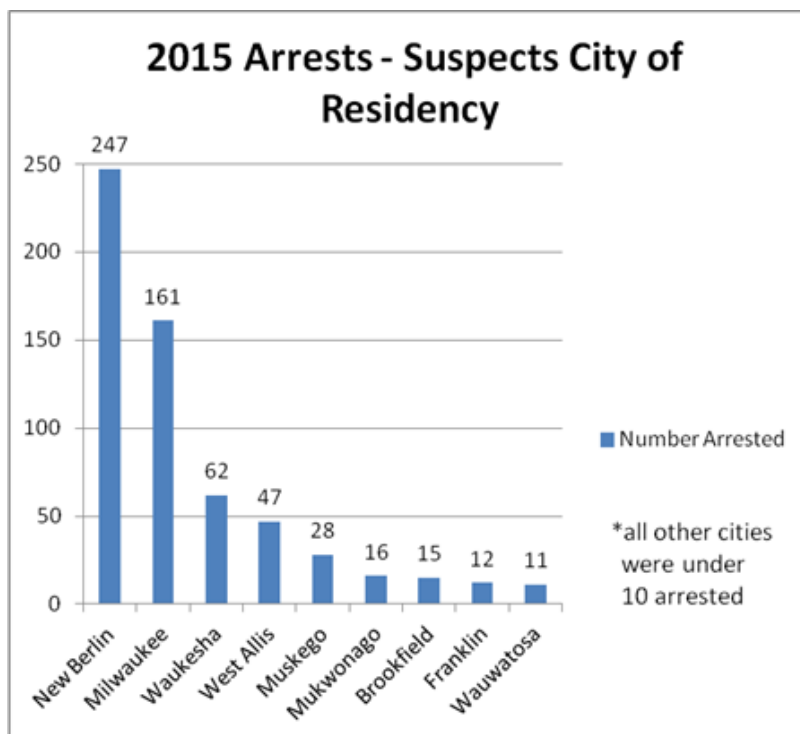
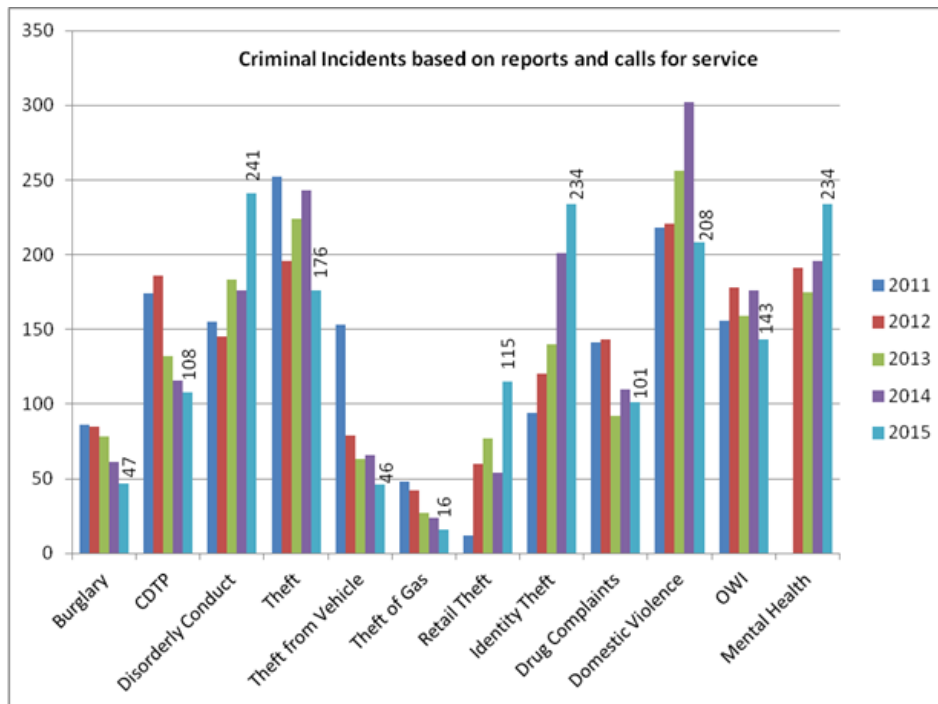
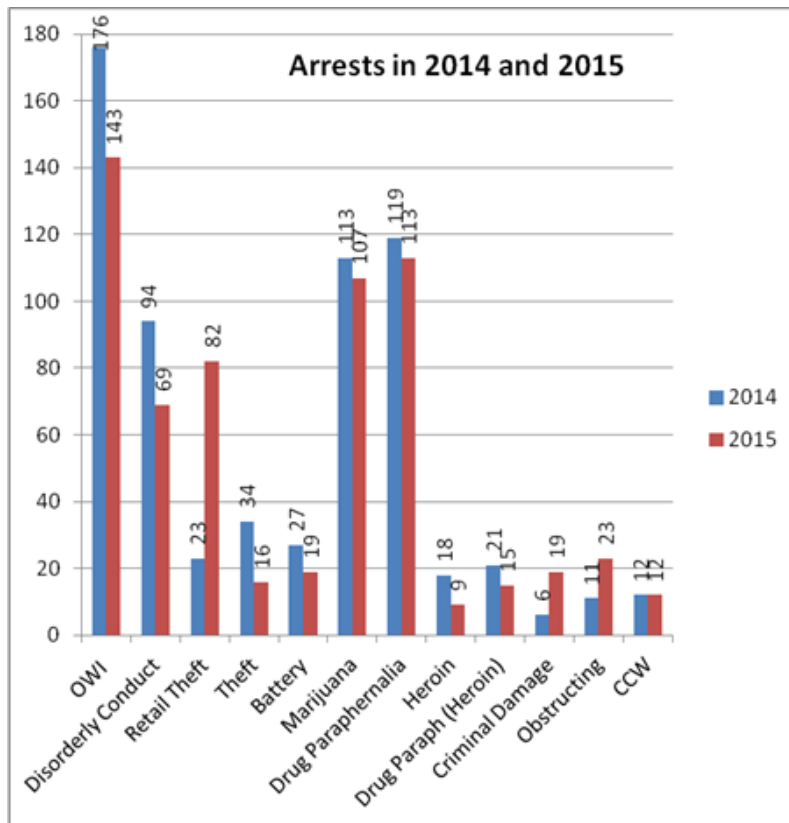


**2015 YEAR END STATISTICS** - as indicated in the below chart, we have experienced a reduction in Burglaries, Criminal Damage (even after accounting for a recent spike of 36 incidents in December), Thefts, Thefts from Vehicles, Theft of Gas, Domestic Violence Incidents, and Operating While Intoxicated. We have experienced an increase in Disorderly Conduct calls for service, Identity Thefts (primarily a result of Fraudulent IRS tax filings), Retail Thefts, and incidents involving mental health concerns. The increase in disorderly conduct and mental health reporting is indicative of a community taking the initiative to protect themselves and help others.

The second chart indicates that the majority of those arrested for various crimes were New Berlin residents, followed by residents of the City of Milwaukee.





Of the more common arrests for our department, Operating While Intoxicated remains the most prevalent, followed by Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Possession of Marijuana. The increase in Retail Theft arrests is attributable, in part, to proactive loss prevention practices at our retail establishments.

Possession of Heroin and Possession of Heroin related Drug Paraphernalia were down from 2014.

**2015 YEAR END PERSPECTIVE** -

although social media can be an extremely useful tool to share information, it is important to keep perspective of crime trends in our city and use accurate

sources. Social media has, at times, led to a misperception regarding an increase in burglaries or other types of crimes. Property crime, including Burglary, Thefts, Thefts from Vehicles, and even, Criminal Damage has been decreasing over the past several years. This is directly related to your partnership with our department. The recent wave of Criminal Damage incidents is a prime example as an alert citizen called our department with a description of the vehicle involved and we were able to arrest four (4) individuals. There are many other examples of citizens and those who work in our city, calling our department to report drunk drivers, suspicious vehicles, and suspicious individuals. Many of these calls led directly to arrests. We look forward to your continued cooperation in 2016 in working to combat crime in our community. We are committed to sharing as much information as quickly as possible with you and encourage you to like us on Facebook as we post current information regarding significant criminal incidents.
