Spring Election and Presidential Preference Vote

Tuesday, April 5th

Polls open 7:00 AM and Close 8:00 PM

The Spring Election & Presidential Preference Vote will be held on April 5th from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM. All polling locations will be open for this election, so be sure to go to your original polling place to cast a ballot. Absentee Voting

In Person Absentee Voting – Starting the third Monday before each election, electors can come to City Hall to fill out an in person absentee ballot. Residents must bring photo ID in order to receive a ballot.

By mail. Voters can request an absentee ballot be mailed to their residence or out of town address. These applications can be found on our website or at City Hall.

Voter Registration: Where to Register to vote:

In the clerk's office. Registrations can be submitted in person at City Hall in the clerk's office. You will also be required to provide proof of residence no matter when you are registering. Registration ends at City Hall the Friday before the election at 5:00 p.m.

At the polls on Election Day. All electors who wish to register must provide proof of residency in order to vote.

What to bring to the Polls (All Voters)

Photo ID. 2016 elections will require voters to show a copy of their photo id to the election inspector. Voters who are already registered should have their photo IDs ready to present to the poll book table inspectors. If you do not have an acceptable photo ID, you can obtain a free Wisconsin ID card for voting from the DMV.

Registering at the Polls

Proof of Residency – Proof that you live at your registered address

WI Drivers License – If you have been issued a Wisconsin Drivers License or ID card, you are required to put your license number on the Voter Registration application. (If you do not have a Wisconsin License or ID, you may use the last 4 digits of your social security number)

Medication Disposal Event

On Saturday, April 30th from 10 a.m.-2 p.m., you can bring your prescription medication, over the counter medication, ointments, sprays, inhalers, creams vials, herbals and pet medication to the Moorland Reserve Health Center for a Drug Collection Event. Biohazardous material (including sharps), mercury, household hazardous waste and personal hygiene products are NOT accepted. For more information on this event click [here](#).
