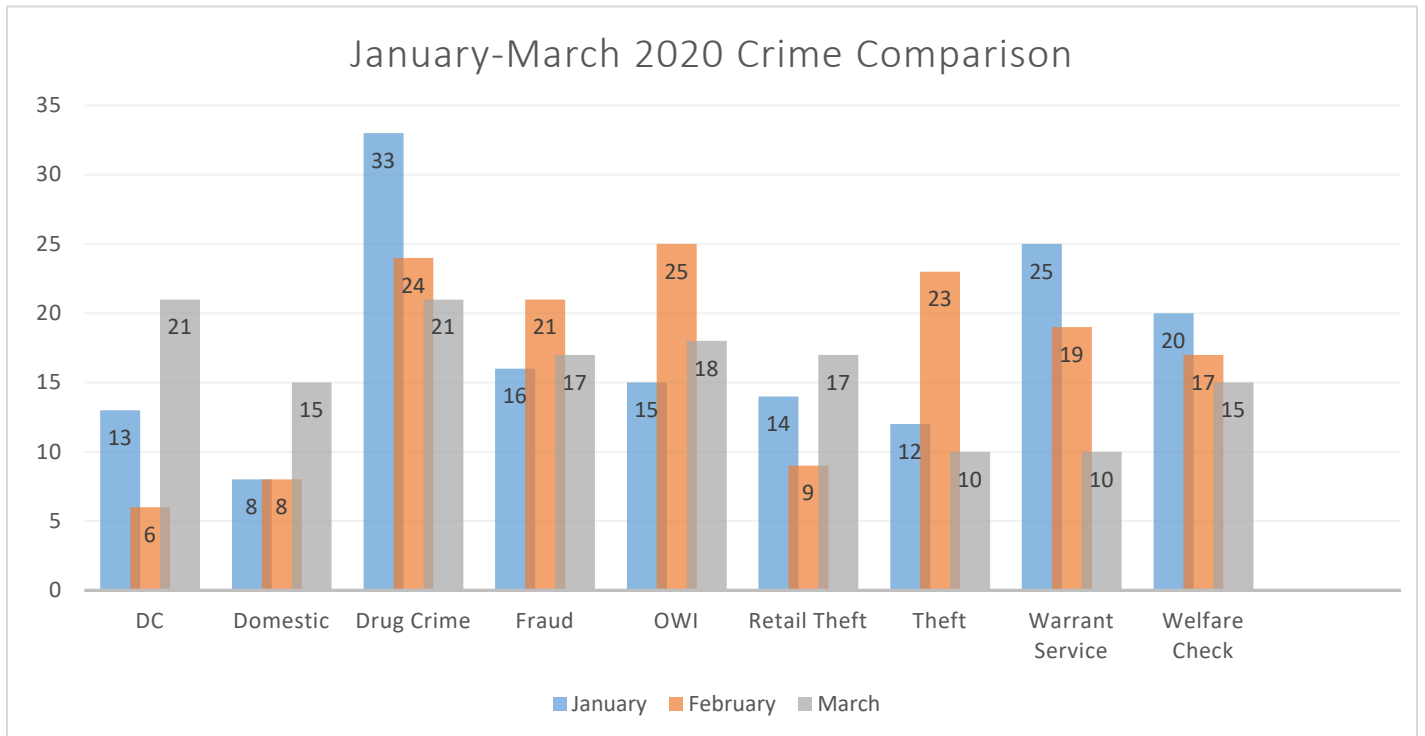


NBPD Monthly Update – April 2020

SITUATIONAL AWARENESS: As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, virtual meetings have become a necessary part of many of our lives. As with anything else on-line, we recommend you take some basic measures to participate in virtual meetings safely. There have been numerous instances reported nationally of people crashing or “Zoombombling” a virtual meeting that had posted a public link or invitation. Virtual meetings or events that require pre-registration via a public link allow you as the host to somewhat vet registrations and only send the link to those participants who registered. That alone may be enough of a deterrent to keep someone with ill intentions from crashing the meeting. Prior to participating in virtual meetings, best practices include checking for security recommendations from whatever software you are using. NEW BERLIN POLICE CRIME STATISTICS: JANUARY – MARCH 2020: The below graph represents top categories during this time period in which our patrol division allocated resources. The majority of drug crimes, OWI’s and Warrant Service incidents are a result of proactive officer activity, usually stemming from a traffic stop. The remainder of the graphed categories in which we become involved, is a result of a victim, witness or a concerned citizen requesting our assistance with that respective incident.



Reported Frauds and Scams are again in one of our top categories of calls for service in the first quarter of 2020. Fortunately, this doesn't have to be the case for the next quarter. All we need to do is eliminate or reduce the scam artist's OPPORTUNITY to victimize us or our loved ones. Just like most other disasters, scam artists soon follow and attempt to take advantage of people during these unfortunate times.

A few quick tips to remember: You should NEVER "pay to receive" your winnings. Never give out any personal identifying information or account numbers unless you have done your own independent research and you are engaged in a legitimate business practice with a legitimate entity. If you have doubts about the legitimacy of anything, error on the side of caution because you are probably right. At the minimum, confer with a trusted confidant regarding the situation. If you have received any solicitations you believe to be a scam, you do not need to contact the police; UNLESS, you became a victim of a scam. Our non-emergency number is 262-782-6640.

The NBPD public dashboard is an interactive map which captures both incidents and arrests occurring within the City of New Berlin. Although we attempt to publish the data on the dashboard on a **DAILY BASIS** (Monday – Friday), there may be occasions when this process may be delayed.
