## New Berlin Police Department Citizens' Police Academy

The New Berlin Police Department Citizens' Academy is a course designed to provide citizens with a better understanding of the operations of our police department. Post-graduation, we encourage graduates to stay involved through an Alumni Association and assist in identifying problems and solutions to crime issues that affect our community. Two sessions are held each year. Each session consists of eleven consecutive 2.5 hour classes held once-a-week.
